Routes for Accreditation/Certification



The ISCP's routes to Accreditation/Certification are shown for all levels of membership in Figure 1.

Recognised psychology degree, entitling Graduate Member status of a nationally recognised professional psychology body.

AssocMISCP Status

Affiliates of the ISCP can upgrade to AssocMISCP status following successful completion of a recognised psychology degree

Minimum 3 years (or pro rata) Initial Professional Development (IPD) at a Graduate level.

Of which a maximum of 2 years and 6 months IPD may have been undertaken as a psychology graduate but prior to becoming an AssocMISCP

Chartership, state or country registration/licence as a qualified psychologist

MISCP Status

AssocMISCPs can upgrade to MISCP status via the portfolio system toward accreditation/
certification

Minimum 3 months membership of the ISCP. *This includes time spent as an AssocMISCP.*

Evidence of two years practice as a coaching psychologist post qualification
